**Bradford-based Rosetta Stone Language Centre helps Afghan asylum seeker in both English and employment**

The Rosetta Stone Language Centre, which is a provider of government-funded English language courses for asylum seekers among other courses, is keen to share with *Yorkshire Post* readers its recent achievements, which are having a positive impact within the asylum community in Bradford.

Ali Abu-Saeed, an Afghan asylum seeker who arrived in Bradford just seven months ago, successfully passed his English language exams with distinction. He then landed a teaching job at the Rosetta Stone Language Centre where he passed his exams. Although his English was already of a high level, he did not have the recognised English language qualifications to work in the UK and so signed up for an English Skills for Life course.

The centre was so impressed by Ali's speed of learning and the help he gave to other students in his class that the Director of Studies, Jill Davies offered him a teaching job, "We were so in awe of Ali's linguistic capabilities and help he gave to other students. I was about to advertise for another teacher but decided to offer the role to Ali. Now he's helping students from similar backgrounds to his own. It's so important to have a member of staff who can empathise with the difficulties asylum students face".

The Rosetta Stone Language Centre has also just been awarded a certificate for *Investors in People* because of its high teaching standards and exam success rates, not only for its government-funded English language courses, but also for Business and General English courses for foreigners.
